

## COVID-19 Funding

The Government of Canada's top priority is the health and safety of all Canadians, including First Nations, Inuit and Métis. Since the beginning of the pandemic, we have been actively working with partners to support Indigenous Peoples and communities in preparing and responding to COVID-19. We recognize that First Nation, Inuit and Métis are among the most at risk and face unique challenges in addressing COVID-19, and that Indigenous leadership, governments and organizations are best placed to determine the needs of Indigenous Peoples and to develop community-based solutions that respond to these challenges.

## Proposal-based COVID-19 Funding Streams

The Ontario Region is currently accepting funding requests under the Indigenous Community Business Fund and Public Health Measures funding streams. The table below summarizes the available funding, application deadlines and where to submit applications / request additional information on the funding stream.

## COVID-19 Funding Allocated to Date

Since March 1, 2020, approximately \$516.5M has been allocated to Ontario Region First Nations, Métis and Indigenous organizations to support COVID-19 response efforts, and \$600.3M to provide additional supports for children and families, for a total of \$1.12B. An additional \$127.8M in recently announced allocations through Budget 2021 are in progress.

Of the \$516.5M that has been allocated to support COVID-19, \$460.2M has been sourced from the \$5.7 billion that has been committed in specific COVID-19 support to Indigenous and northern communities and organizations. The remaining \$56.3M has been sourced from existing funding sources to support COVID-19 response efforts.
