Developing the NAN Housing Strategy

The Nishnawbe Aski Nation (NAN) Housing Strategy will fulfill the right of access to adequate housing and end the collective housing emergency in NAN territory. NAN and Together Design Lab have partnered with NAN First Nations for a 3 year project to:

- Work at the community and regional level to develop housing solutions and action plans that recognize the unique needs, geographies and cultures of NAN First Nations.
- Create community-led approaches to data collection and problem identification. Support NAN First Nations' right to self-determination to their housing systems.
- Support NAN First Nations' right to self-determination to their housing systems.
- Encourage flexibility and creation of design solutions rooted in local lived experience.

Youth Gathering Housing Workshop

The NAN Housing Strategy team hosted a workshop on February 15, 2019 at the NAN Youth Gathering to learn about youth perspectives on housing. The workshop was a mix of discussions and housing design. Participants explored the unique impacts of housing on youth, goals for housing in their community and the NAN territory and designed their own smaller homes, showing how design can meet their housing needs.

What We Learned

Participants at the workshop shared their perspectives and experiences with housing. The need for safe and healthy homes was an important theme throughout the session. Participants highlighted the connection between housing and its impacts on mental and physical health as well social relations; it was shared that right now many youth don't have a space in which they feel comfortable.

"That every family has a home"

Through conversations and designing new housing layouts the importance of having your own space was identified in order to be able to grow, feel safe and comfort for all youth, including youth in-care. The need for space is important for everyone inside the home as well as space around the home to allow for a variety of uses including gardening and children's play areas.

"Feel hope to access housing"

Workshop participants also identified the need for more diverse housing types for singles, couples and those wishing to live with roommates. Constructing diverse housing types is a critical need and it was identified that being able to see even small scale change such as two to three smaller homes in each community in the next five years would indicate a positive step forward.

Beyond providing housing for youth, support is needed for young people transitioning into their own homes. Participants shared that there can be a stigma about responsibility and youth taking care of their own spaces. As a solution it was suggested that different types of assistance are needed such as guidance for basic home maintenance and also improved physical and mental health programs in community would provide youth and young families with an opportunity to be fully independent within their own spaces.

Special attention is also needed for youth incare and youth transitioning out of care. Group homes and foster homes should be welcoming and safe places for youth. Youth transitioning out of care may have a more difficult time accessing housing in their communities and in the city. Greater support and consideration should be given to youth in these situations to prevent homelessness and housing insecurity.

Housing needs and issues effect demographic groups differently. Throughout the process of creating the NAN Housing Strategy, youth will continually be engaged to learn about their needs, goals and aspirations.
