## **Mental Health Policy Analyst**

### **Health Transformation Department**

#### **SUMMARY:**

In October 2021, the Nishnawbe Aski Nation (NAN) Chiefs in Assembly passed *Resolution 21-11*, declaring a Mental Health and Addictions Crisis in NAN territory. The role of Mental Health Policy Analyst is to work interdepartmentally to collaboratively develop a NAN wide framework to address mental health and addictions in NAN territory. The successful candidate will synthesize the existing work products (reports, gathering summaries, etc.) and initiatives internally at NAN. Additionally, the Mental Health Policy Analyst will address the alignment of external programs and services available to NAN First Nations to develop a holistic NAN Mental Health and Addictions Strategy. The Mental Health Policy Analyst will also support the NAN Health Transformation team in the development of goals and objectives as directed.

#### **DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:**

- Work with other NAN departments to develop a NAN Mental Health and Addictions Strategy using both a life course and social determinants of health approach for interdepartmental collaboration.
- Work to identify the subject matter experts that are required to develop and implement the NAN Mental Health and Addictions Strategy.
- Research, review, monitor and analyze current provincial and federal policies, legislation, programs, services
  and initiatives that affect the mental health, mental health services and
  members of NAN as part of the Health Transformation Team.
- Work in collaboration with NAN Communications to develop internal and external materials to support advocacy and awareness of mental health and addictions.
- Collaborate with the Health Transformation Team to create recommendations, correspondence, proposals, briefing notes, memos, letters, and options to advise and seek recommendations from the NAN Executive, NAN Health Advisory Group, Health Transformation Advisory Council and Chiefs Council on Health Transformation.
- Participate in, promote, facilitate, and coordinate mechanisms for advocacy at NAN First Nations, Tribal Councils and Health Authorities levels.
- Plan, facilitate and attend any meetings, working groups or gatherings that are related to Mental Health & Addictions and the development of a NAN Mental Health & Addictions Strategy.
- Perform other related duties as assigned and required.

#### **ACCOUNTABILITY:**

The Mental Health Policy Analyst is under the supervision of the Health Policy Manager with overall accountability for performance to the Chief Administrative Officer.
