We welcome diverse presentation proposals relevant to early childhood education, elementary and secondary schools, post-secondary education, and research on First Nations education. Topics of interest include but are not limited to:

- Promoting "Wellness for Youth", advocating for change, representation, reconciliation in organizations.
- Two spirit information, engaging elders to want to teach and share in school settings.
- Anishinaabemowin, five teachings, water and plant teachings, art, dance, and drumming.
- Detailed workshops on harvesting wild game.
- More examples of how to teach landbased in urban settings.
