Starts at home - with YOU!

Emergencies can happen without warning — wildland fires, floods, power outages, and more.

MAKE A PLAN:

Talk with your household about what to do in an emergency. Plan escape routes, meeting spots, and pack a home emergency kit.

BEFORE EVACUATING:

Bring your emergency kit and secure your home — shut off water, gas, and electronics, and close all windows and doors.

Packing a Home Emergency Kit:

- () Shelf-stable food
- Full water bottle
- Flashlight & batteries
- Charging cords
- First-aid kit
- Emergency contact list
- Wallet with identification
- Copies of important documents
- Medications & prescription information

- Extra clothes & hygiene items
- (Glasses, hearing aids, cane, wheelchair)
- () Childcare supplies
- Signalling device (whistle, mirror)
- Pet supplies

TIP:

Remember to increase items for every person in your household and pack in a portable bag you can take with you if evacuating.
