

Help prevent human-caused wildland fires by following safe outdoor burning practices:

- Check Local Fire Hazard:
 Avoid burning during high hazard.
- Never Leave a Fire Unattended: Stay alert and present.
- Choose a Safe Location:
 Burn 15 feet away from buildings,
 trees, and flammable materials.
- Clear the Burn Area:
 Remove any dry leaves, grass, and debris from the site.
- Monitor Weather Conditions:
 Never burn on dry, windy days.
- Keep Fire Control Tools Near:
 Always have a full water or sand bucket nearby.
- Avoid Firewood Against Buildings: Stack firewood separately.
